# Claiming Universal Credit Online

You need to claim Universal Credit online. If you have no access to the internet – see below:

#### Where can you go to claim online?

There are approx 400 computers available to use for FREE in Derbyshire Libraries. They are in the following locations:

Chesterfield – New Beetwell Street Clay Cross – Kenning Park, Holmgate Road Dronfield – Manor House, High Street Eckington – Market Street Holmewood – Heath Road Killamarsh – Stanley Street Wingerworth – Parish Rooms

### How to join the library service

To use library computers and other services that the libraries offer you need to be a member. You can become a member for FREE and to do this you must:

- Download an application from Derbyshire County Council website: www.derbyshire.gov.uk or go to your local library for an application form.
- You will need one form of ID the documents accepted are: driving licence, bank statement, building society book, Post Office savings book, welfare benefits award letter, bus pass, receipted bills, council tax demand, medical card.

## What can you do on the computers?

#### You can:

- · Claim Benefits online
- Surf the Web
- Use email
- Create your own documents using Microsoft Word and Excel
- Develop presentations and publications With Microsoft Powerpoint and Publisher
- Store your own documents and files on your own internet based storage or USB sticks which are for sale within the libraries.

### They cannot be used for:

- Saving work on the library computer
- Watching live telephone broadcasts

All Derbyshire libraries provide access to a FREE Wi-Fi network, there is no password needed to connect.

#### Help, Assistance & Booking a Computer

- Library staff can help you make your Universal Credit claim online. You will need to be a member of the library service and you will need to book an appointment.
